

I can point to the symbol which describes my needs.


The person I am using this board with will ask me yes or no questions to get more information to help me.



The Vivid Light Walk is free and spans across 5 zones:

- Zone 1 Circular Quay and The Rocks
- Zone 2 Barangaroo
- Zone 3 Darling Harbour
- Zone 4 Goods Line and Inner City
- Zone 5 Martin Place and CBD

Parts of the Vivid Light Walk are steep up-hill or down-hill. All paths are bitumen or concrete with some paths linking the various light attractions.

The Vivid Light Walk is accessible for mobility devices and prams.

Tickets

If I have purchased a ticket to any of the Vivid Ideas, Vivid Music or Vivid Food events, my digital ticket will be sent to my email or mobile from the relevant ticketing agent and can be scanned from my mobile device. I don't need to print these tickets.



Companion Cards

Support workers or essential companions of people with a disability are offered free entry to some Vivid Sydney events. I will need to show my companion card to ticket staff when I get to an event. I can book my companion card tickets online using the companion booking page.

Crowds

There will be many people on the Vivid Sydney Light Walk, especially on weekends. I need to allow for additional time to move around or see the attractions. If I would like to see Vivid Sydney when it is less crowded, I can come on a weeknight (Monday-Thursday).

Hidden Disability Sunflower Lanyard

Vivid Sydney supports the Hidden Disability Sunflower. The lanyard is a way for me to indicate to Vivid Sydney staff that I may need extra support, time, and understanding. It is ok if I don't have a buddy, I can still attend Vivid Sydney and get help when I need it.






What else to bring?

Zone 1 – Circular Quay

Pedestrian Route

- From Barangaroo: I can follow the Vivid Light Walk through Barangaroo Reserve and Argyle Street. It will take me about 20 minutes from Stargazer Lawn.
- From Martin Place: I can follow the Vivid Light Walk through Martin Place, then travel towards Circular Quay on Phillip Street. It will take me about 14 minutes from Phillip Street.

Train

- Monday Thursday I can take the train directly to Circular Quay station. When I exit, I can turn
 left to go towards Museum of Contemporary Art, or I can turn right to go towards the Sydney
 Opera House.
- On Saturday nights and Sunday 8 June 6pm-11pm trains will not drop off passengers at Circular Quay station. I need to get off at Wynyard station and continue to Circular Quay on George Street. It will take me about 10 minutes.

Metro

- I can take the Metro directly to Martin Place.
- From Martin Place: I can follow the Vivid Light Walk through Martin Place, then travel along Phillip Street towards Circular Quay. It will take me about 14 minutes from Phillip Street.

Zone 1 - Circular Quay continued

Light Rail

- Monday Thursday: I can catch the light rail directly to Circular Quay.
- Friday's from 6pm and Saturday Sunday from 5pm: The light rail won't go to Circular Quay. Instead, I will need to get off at Town Hall and travel along George Street to Circular Quay. It will take me about 20 minutes.

Bus

- Monday Thursday: Buses run regularly to and from the city. I can visit <u>Trip Planner</u> transportnsw.info for more information.
- Friday nights from 6pm and Saturday-Sunday from 5pm: Buses stop at Martin Place instead of Circular Quay due to road closures. I can follow the Light Walk through Martin place then travel along Phillip Street to get to Circular Quay. It will take me about 14 minutes from Phillip Street.

Ferry

- I can catch a ferry directly to Circular Quay. Ferries to Circular Quay are very popular during Vivid Sydney, and I should expect long lines at ferry wharves, especially on weekends.
- If the ferry is full, I can use a train, metro, light rail, or bus instead.
- All passengers must exit the ferry at the last stop return trips are not allowed.

Zone 2 – Barangaroo

Pedestrian Route

- From Circular Quay: I travel along Argyle Street. It will take me about 19 minutes.
- From Cockle Bay: I travel along the harbourside promenade passing King St Wharf. It will take me about 18 minutes.

1 Train

 The closest station is Wynyard. I follow the Wynyard Walk tunnel and Sussex Street Bridge. It will take about 5 minutes to get to Barangaroo.

Metro

I can take the metro directly to Barangaroo.
 I exit the station and travel towards the water. I can follow the Vivid Light Walk along Wulugul Walk, then turn right onto Boot Boot path. It will take me about 10 minutes to reach Stargazer Lawn.

- Metro From Martin Place: I can take the Metro to Barangaroo Station it will take me about 9 minutes.
- B Friday Sunday and Monday 9 June: Some buses on Argyle Place and Dalgety Road are moved to Hickson Road. I can travel along Hickson Road to Towns Place and follow the Light Walk through Barangaroo Reserve. This will take about 14 minutes

Ferry

- F3 and F4 ferries stop at Barangaroo Wharf.
- I can travel along the boardwalk past Crown Sydney, follow the path into Barangaroo Reserve it will take me about 7 minutes.

Zone 3 – Darling Harbour

Pedestrian Route

- From Barangaroo: I travel along the harbourside promenade passing King St Wharf. It will take me about 18 minutes.
- From The Goods Line: I can follow the Light
 Walk through The Goods Line then cross the
 road at Hay Street and turn left into Tumbalong
 Boulevard. It will take me about 7 minutes.

🕕 Train

- I take a train to Town Hall Station.
- I exit south onto Bathurst Street and travel downhill to Darling Quarter and Tumbalong Park. It will take me about 10 minutes.

Metro

- I take the metro to Gadigal Station.
- I take the Bathurst Street exit then travel downhill to Darling Quarter and Tumbalong Park. It will take me about 12 minutes.

l Light Rail

- I can take the L1 Dulwich Hill Line.
- Exhibition Centre Stop for Tumbalong Park and ICC Sydney Exhibition Halls.
- Convention Stop for ICC Sydney Convention Centre and Cockle Bay.
- Pyrmont Bay Stop for Maritime Museum and Pyrmont Bay Park.

Ferry

- From Circular Quay: I can catch the F4 ferry to Pyrmont Bay Wharf. It will take me about 28 minutes.
- From Barangaroo: I can catch the F4 ferry to Pyrmont Bay Wharf. It will take me about 10 minutes.

Zone 4 — The Goods Line

Pedestrian Route

From Darling Harbour: Travel along
 Tumbalong Boulevard and turn right onto
 Hay Street. It will take me about 7 minutes.

Train

- I take a train to Central Station
- I need to enter the Devonshire Street Tunnel and follow through towards and past Lee Street. Continue underground and I will arrive at The Goods Line.

🕒 Light Rail

- I take the L1 Dulwich Hill Line to Central Station.
- I need to enter the Devonshire Street Tunnel and follow through towards and past Lee Street. Continue underground and I will arrive at The Goods Line.

B Bus

- I can catch a bus to Harris Street before Broadway. It will take me about 5 minutes to get to The Goods Line from here.
- I can catch a bus to Railway Square and take the Devonshire Street Tunnel to The Goods Line. It will take me about 7 minutes.

Zone 5 – Martin Place

Pedestrian Route

From Circular Quay: I travel towards
 Martin Place on Phillip Street. It will take me about 14 minutes.

1 Train

- I can take a train directly to Martin Place. I can exit to street level using escalator or lift.
- I can take a train to Wynyard. I can exit on York Street and travel south until I can turn left on Wynyard Street, then turn right on George Street. Travel along George Street until I get to the intersection of Martin Place. It will take me about 5 minutes.

Metro

- I can take the Metro to Martin Place.
 Escalators or lifts will take me to street level.
- From Barangaroo: I can take the Metro to Martin Place Station. It will take me about 9 minutes.

Light Rail

- Monday Thursday from Circular Quay or Central Station: I catch the Light Rail to Wynyard. I can travel along George Street towards the intersection of Martin Place. It will take me about 2 minutes.
- Friday's from 6pm and Saturday-Sunday from 5pm: The Light Rail will truncate at Town Hall. I will need to get off at Town Hall and travel along George Street to Martin Place. It will take me about 10 minutes.

Bus

 Regular buses make stops at Martin Place on Elizabeth Street, or nearby at Wynyard Station which will take me about 5 minutes to get to Martin Place.

Accessible Rideshare



Large crowds and closed roads around Vivid Sydney can make it hard for Taxis and Rideshares to safely drop off and pick up passengers in certain areas of the city. There is a list of accessible pick up and drop off locations on the next page.

Wheelchair Book and Ride

Wheelchair Book and Ride is the centralised booking service for wheelchair accessible taxis in the Sydney metropolitan area.

Wheelchair Book and Ride makes it easier to secure accessible taxi bookings for people who are unable to access public transport because they use a wheelchair.

You can book a wheelchair accessible taxi online or by calling 139 000. The taxi bookings and general enquiries phone line is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Sydney Opera House Free Shuttle

Sydney Opera House operates a free shuttle bus service for elderly and patrons with access needs. Seating is limited and available on a fist come, first served basis.

The bus runs between Circular Quay, with pick-up opposite Wharf 2 on Phillip Street and drop-off is at the Opera House site entry. This service will run before and after major performances during Vivid Sydney.

During the day, an alternate buggy service is available from site entry at the bottom of Macquarie Street. The buggy is wheelchair accessible. Please contact the Box Office on <u>02</u> <u>9250 7777</u> to confirm operating hours for the shuttle bus and buggy service.

Vivid Sydney offers bookable and complimentary accessible minibus parking.

Driving and Road Closures

Some roads will be closed and there will be new parking restrictions from 3pm every afternoon until 1am in the morning. I can't drive to vantage points or see Vivid Sydney from my car.

There will be lots of traffic on the roads that remain open so I should allow extra travel time, or I can catch public transport.

Special Event Clearways

Parts of the road will be designated as 'special event clearways' from Friday 23rd of May to Saturday 14th of June. I can't park in a clearway even if I have a parking permit or a mobility permit. There will be bright yellow signs showing where the clearways are. I need to read the signs carefully and check what times the clearway starts and finishes.

If my car is parked in a clearway, it will be towed, and I will have to pay a fee to get it back. If my car has been towed, I need to call this number 132 701.

Car Parking

Car parking in the city will be busy and there will be lots of restrictions. I might choose to leave my car at home and catch public transport.

If I choose to drive, roads might close while my car is parked. Cars aren't allowed to drive on closed roads or exit car parks on closed roads unless a Police Officer says it's okay.

The closest public car park to Circular Quay is the Sydney Opera House. It has 11 accessible parking spaces on level 1, and 12 accessible parking spaces on level 6 for people who have a mobility permit. I can book these parking spaces online at Wilson Parking's website.

Level 1 and level 6 have access to lifts.

Wheelchairs

The Vivid Sydney Light Walk and installations are mobility device accessible. Some installations have ramps installed. Some paths are steep and may require assistance.

The crowds might make it hard to move around on busier nights, usually weekends and the Monday public holiday.



Assistance animals

I can bring my certified assistance animal. They must be on a leash in all parts of Circular Quay, The Rocks, Barangaroo, Darling Harbour, The Goods Line and Martin Place.

The Vivid Light Walk is outdoors. Please be prepared for all weather conditions and bring a raincoat, umbrella, or spray jacket.

Public safety is Vivid Sydney's number one priority and should severe weather conditions be experienced there may be restrictions on which areas I can attend. I need to keep up to date by visiting the website and Vivid Sydney social channels.

Sensory Information

When I visit Vivid Sydney, I might come across different sensory experiences. Vivid Sydney has specialty lighting, projections, visual effects and moving light effects such as motion activated interactive lighting and chasing lights. These include:

- Very bright areas
- Very dark areas
- Flashing lights
- Things you can touch and feel
- Loud areas

- Announcements that come through speakers
- Steep inclines and declines
- Crowding
- Motion responsive light and sound

Low Sensory Installations

There are low-sensory installations I can attend if I feel overwhelmed by bright lighting and loud noises. The low-sensory installations still have lights and sounds but they are at a lower level.

Some Vivid Light Walk installations may feature low sound but include flashing or strobe lighting.

This may affect people with sensory sensitivities, epilepsy, or other conditions. I can visit <u>Vivid Sydney</u> website for specific installation information on each installation.

Quiet Space

If the crowds, noise, or bright lights feel like too much, I can step into one of Vivid Sydney's quiet spaces.

Volunteers will be there, ready to help, creating a calm and comfortable retreat where I can take a break and reset.

The quiet spaces are located in the following areas:

- Circular Quay, corner of George Street & Alfred Street
- Tumbalong Boulevard, near Tumbalong Park in Darling Harbour






Volunteers

Vivid Sydney volunteers can support me with wayfinding, directions and communication during the event. I can bring a support worker or companion if I require hands-on assistance such as wheelchair pushing, side by side support or trained assistance.

Vivid Sydney volunteers will be wearing bright pink jackets labelled volunteer and colourful Vivid Sydney lanyards.

Accessible Viewing Areas




There are 4 accessible viewing areas. I don't need to book seats for the accessible viewing areas. I can bring a blanket and get a front row view while taking a break from the crowd.

Hickson Road Reserve, Dawes Point

There is a supervised viewing area at the Hickson Road Reserve at Dawes Point. I will be able to see the Sydney Opera House and other harbourside lighting attractions. The area is open from 6pm- 11pm each evening.

Sydney Opera House

There is a supervised viewing area at the Sydney Opera House. I will be able to see the Museum of Contemporary Art, Circular Quay and other harbourside lighting attractions. The area is open from 6pm – 11pm every night.

Museum of Contemporary Art Australia

There is a supervised viewing area at the Museum of Contemporary Art. I will be able to see the Sydney Opera House and other harbourside lighting attractions. The area is open from 6pm – 11pm each evening.

Barangaroo

There is a supervised viewing area at Barangaroo Reserve. I will be able to see the Vivid Light installation *An Act of Being*. This area is open from 6pm – 11pm each evening.

An Act of Being blends contemporary dance, physical theatre, and innovative gostMESH technology to reflect on the ongiong impact of government policies on First Nations communities. Created by acclaimed Bangarra Dance Theatre in collaboration with Reconciliation Australia.



Tumbalong Park, Darling Harbour


