
Road closures, special event clearways and public transport from 23 May - 14 June

Please note: Trains will not drop off passengers at Circular Quay from 6pm to 11pm on Saturdays and Sunday of the long weekend. Light Rail services will not run between Circular Quay and Town Hall from 6pm on Friday nights and on weekends from 5pm.







What is Vivid Sydney?



Special event clearways



Special event clearways will be in effect on various key roads in the city between 3pm and midnight each night. Clearways are strict no-parking zones and apply even to local residents and Mobility Parking Scheme permit holders.

Check signs carefully as vehicles left in clearways will be towed and a fee applies.

If your vehicle is towed, call the Traffic Information Line on 132 701 to find its new location.

Road closures

Major road closures will be in place from 5pm each evening and some local roads close earlier from 3pm. Most roads will remain closed until midnight each night, and until 1am on Saturdays. Motorists are encouraged to avoid travel into the CBD and to expect delays as traffic will be heavy on detays routes.

Please plan ahead and familiarise yourself with the road closure locations and times. Relocate your vehicle outside the road closure and special event clearway areas if required as once closures are in place, no vehicle movement will be permitted until roads have safely reopened.

Pedestrian access

To reduce potential congestion, Vivid Sydney will have a one-way pedestrian flow in some areas of the Light Walk.

Visitors are asked to observe instructions given by marshals and volunteers, and pay attention to the variable message signage, which will be regularly updated. For walking route details between locations and transport hubs, visit vividsydney.com/transport.

Important information for local residents

- Vivid Sydney will run from Friday 23 May Saturday 14 June 2025
- The event will attract large crowds, particularly on the weekends and the Monday public holiday 9 June.
- Road closures and special event clearways will be in place, please familiarise yourself with these using the map on the reverse of this fiyer.
- Bus and light rail services in the city will be affected and ferries may reach capacity on weekends, visit transportnsw.info for real-time transport updates.
- Extra public transport services will be available.
- Be sure to plan your trip in advance and allow extra time to get to and around the city.

Getting around during Vivid Sydney

In 2025, Vivid Sydney spans five key zones—Circular Quay and The Rocks, Barangaroo, Darling Harbour, The Goods Line and inner city, and Martin Place and the CBD—all of which are easily accessible by public transport. Additional public transport services will operate throughout the festival period. With major road closures and parking restrictions in effect, public transport is the most convenient way to travel. Ensure you have a valid Opal card and top it up online in advance to avoid queues at top-up machines. Alternatively, you can use a contactless debit or credit card, or a linked device, to tap on and off transport services.

Buses and light rail services in the city will be affected and will use different stops while roads are closed for the event. Keep in mind that ferries are a popular way to travel during Vivid Sydney and typically reach capacity on weekends, so plan a backup option too.
