WHAT IS VIVID SYDNEY?

Vivid Sydney is the world's largest festival of light, music and ideas and now the largest event in Australia. For 23 days - from 25 May to 16 June 2018 - the event places a spotlight on Sydney and reinforces its position as the creative services hub of the Asia Pacific region. The festival is owned, managed and produced by Destination NSW, the NSW Government's tourism and major events agency. In 2017 Vivid Sydney attracted a record 2.33 million attendees and injected over \$143 million into NSW's visitor economy.

VIVID SYDNEY PRECINCTS

CIRCULAR QUAY AND THE SYDNEY OPERA HOUSE

This year Customs House is back featuring a heart-warming projection of May Gibbs' iconic characters, Snugglepoot and Cuddlepote, alongside other crowd favourites; the Museum of Contemporary Art Australia and Cadmans Cottage. See the world-renowned projections on the Sails of the Sydney Opera House and book tickets to some of the best contemporary music artists in town as they take centre stage for Vivid LIVE at Sydney Opera House.

THE ROCKS

Venture into this historic precinct where laneways, heritage architecture and leafy streets create the perfect backdrop for the Vivid Light Walk.

THE ROYAL BOTANIC GARDEN SYDNEY

Vivid Sydney's bright lights will illuminate the Royal Botanic Garden Sydney again in 2018, where visitors will follow a pathway that weaves through an exciting nocturnal environment inspired by nature. Entry is via the Queen Elizabeth II Gate on the eastern side of the Sydney Opera House Forecourt via East Circular Quay.

DARLING HARBOUR

Once again, this harbourside precinct is the setting for one of the most thrilling spectacles of Vivid Sydney 2018, the astonishing and technologically advanced Fantastic Oceans. Don't miss the Tumbalong Lights inclusive playground at Tumbalong Park and the projection on the roof of the Australian National Maritime Museum.

BARANGAROO

Sydney's newest waterfront dining district is back! Barangaroo will glow under layers of light and sound that evoke the surrounding waterways, with the precinct coming to life through the magnificent art of puppetry.

HARBOUR LIGHTS

View the spectacle of Vivid Sydney from the harbour foreshore or travel around Sydney Harbour aboard one of the many participating vessels which depart from Circular Quay and King Street Wharf.

LUNA PARK - NEW

Vivid Sydney extends to new precinct Luna Park Sydney, where the iconic amusement park will come alive with special large-scale light projections and for the first time the Park's iconic Ferris Wheel will be lit for the Festival.

TARONGA ZOO

Vivid Sydney's wildest precinct will light up once again, shining a light on conservation and the wonders of wildlife with incredible animal light sculptures, brighter and bolder than ever before.

CHATSWOOD

Vivid Sydney at Chatswood this year presents Lightscape, an eclectic celebration of food, fashion, light, the planet and the cosmos. See Light Market, a pop up food market built from recycled materials and immerse yourself in The Concourse featuring a 360-degree projection of amazing imagery from NASA.

KINGS CROSS

Vivid KX celebrates bright lights, iconic local artists and stay-up-late music. The colourful strip along Darlinghurst Road will be lit up with a spectacular display of light and life, and the famous Coca-Cola sign sparkles again in 2018 with a creative colour show.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR LOCAL RESIDENTS

Vivid Sydney (25 May-16 June 2018) is the world's largest festival of light, music and ideas.

For 23 consecutive nights from 6pm to 11pm, Vivid Sydney transforms our Harbour City into a colourful canvas and celebrates Sydney as the creative hub of the Asia-Pacific with large-scale light installations and projections; free family events; music performances and collaborations; and creative ideas, discussion and debate.

The event, now in its 10th year, attracts visitors from across Australia and the world. In 2017 more than 2.3 million people attended Vivid Sydney.

Vivid Sydney attracts large crowds, particularly on the weekends, so be sure to plan your trip in advance and allow plenty of extra time to get to and around the city. To avoid the larger weekend crowds, consider visiting earlier in the week.

GETTING AROUND THE CITY DURING VIVID SYDNEY

EXTRA PUBLIC TRANSPORT SERVICES

Thousands of extra services will run during Vivid Sydney and all precincts are easily accessible by public transport. With major road closures and parking restrictions in place, the best way to travel between precincts is to leave the car at home and catch public transport. Make sure to have a valid Opal card and top it up before you travel to avoid queues at machines.

Buses in the city will be affected by the road closures and will use temporary stops. Ferries are also popular during Vivid Sydney so have a backup transport option in mind. For all the details on transport services during the festival visit: vividsydney.com/transport.

ROAD CLOSURES AND CLEARWAYS

Key roads in the Sydney CBD, Circular Quay and The Rocks will be closed each night during the festival and parking restrictions will be in place. **To keep pedestrians safe, roads will be closed from 7pm on weekdays, 6pm on Fridays and 5pm on weekends. Roads should reopen by midnight each night.**

Access to your property will be affected while roads are closed as vehicles are not permitted to exit a driveway or carpark onto a closed road. If you require access to your vehicle during the event, you will need to relocate it to a suitable location outside the closure area before the roads are closed. Once closures are in place, no vehicle movements will be permitted until roads have safely reopened.

Special event clearways will be in effect on most roads in the city between 3pm and midnight each night. Clearways are no parking zones, even for local residents and Mobility Parking Scheme permit holders. Check signs carefully as vehicles left in clearways will be towed and a fee applies. If your vehicle is towed, call the Traffic Information Line on 132 701 to find its new location.

PEDESTRIAN ACCESS

The Vivid Light Walk will travel in a one-way direction to ease crowd congestion and improve pedestrian safety. For walking route details between precincts and transport hubs, visit vividsydney.com/transport.

Construction of the 12km light rail route from Circular Quay to Randwick and Kingsford is underway. Parts of George Street and Alfred Street are closed for this project and may affect how you walk around the city during Vivid Sydney. Wayfinding directional signs, event staff and volunteers will be on site to help you find your way.

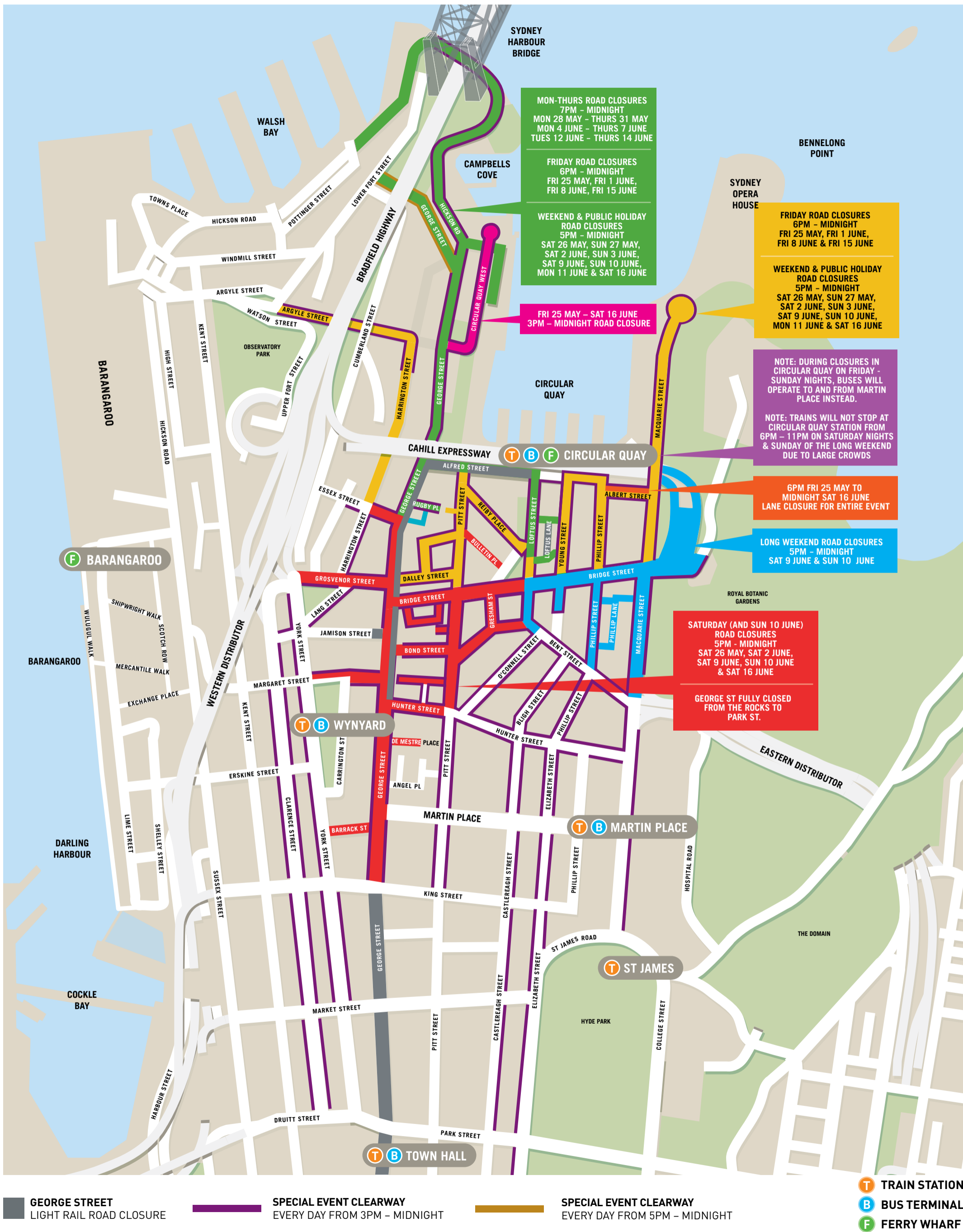
